We are getting bigger turnouts at our social events so thanks to all the helpers that help clean up after each event, this is much appreciated and especially on huge nights all the help offered is greatly appreciated and makes all the effort worthwhile; so thanks again!

On a more sombre note we are still having trouble with people speeding in the club grounds. This is a big problem and huge concern as our club has a lot of children who run and play around the park. It has been noted that some of the cars speeding are guests trying to get in the gate before it closes.

Guests need to stop at the gate, sign in and then <u>WAIT</u> for their sponsoring member to swipe them in. Members are responsible for who they let in the gate which includes telling their guests to obey our **10k speed limit** and to follow club rules at all times. (Club rules permanently advertised in our Newsletter-see below).

Cars coming in and out of the gate can be seen on cctv which can be tracked to the member that opened the gate. If you do bring guests to our club it is the members responsibility to keep them informed of our club rules. Please be aware that constant rule breaking may lead to a member having their key turned off. It has also been noted that some have been trying to force the electric gate open; please note our club will not be held responsible for damages to cars trying to get in through the gate inappropriately.

So for guests our club rule is:-

- Stop, Sign in and WAIT
- Member swipes you in
- **<u>10k speed</u>** limit in the club at all times
- Same member swipes their guest out (on site members are not there to sign your guests out)

We still have the Easter long weekend coming up and we will be monitoring people coming in and out of the gate, in particular whether the speed limit is obeyed. This has been a huge concern with many of our members and it has been noted that up to 6 cars have came in on one members fob. So please remind your guests to stop, sign in, **slow down** and obey the <u>10k speed limit</u> in the park!

While we are on the subject of speed, there is a water speed limit of 5 knots from the water's edgeto 200 metres. Speed limit sign in-situ at Hobbs Harbour. I know many inland waters are 50 metres however this is a Victorian State rule which has been enforced on our lake and must be followed-so please keep speed to 5 knots. The water police do frequent our lake so please be aware that you could get caught and fined if you are not obeying this or any other rule!

On a positive note, the caretaker's cottage is nearly finished, we just need to do the painting outside. Neil seems to be happy with all the work that has been done and it looks like a brand new home, a huge thanks to Laurie the builder (member) along with Scotty our treasurer for all the extra hours put in for this build.

Neil is doing much better now and is getting about a lot more. He is still working hard as usual and the park is looking its best. There are still some vans that could do with a tidy up. Just doing a general tidy up around

your van changes the overall appearance of van sites and improves the outlook of the park. I have noticed a lot of van owners doing really nice improvements; well done!

We appreciate that this was your holiday time and you were at the club to relax. It is great to see the club spirit triumph and to see us all pull together to do our bit. We have two working bees left this club financial year. If you have not attended either the September or the December working bees then in order to receive the discount on the works levy you will need to attend either the April or July working bee. If for some reason you are unable to attend the working bees please see either Neil or me about other duties you may be able to do. When attending a working bee or carrying out alternative duties please ensure that your name is marked off. This will ensure you receive the discount when the next year's fees come out.

Working Bees:

Each year and to every membership there is a works levy of \$150.00. This levy will be discounted by 100% if that membership is represented at one of the 4 working bee held each club financial year. If you cannot attend working please see the works manager to arrange other duties

This fee can be waved at the discretion of the committee.

There are club sailing races that are run on the 2^{nd} weekend of each month. We are always looking for assistance in running these races. Currently the sailors in the club are running the races and manning the rescue boat. As a consequence there are less sailors on the water. If we could get assistance to drive and man the rescue boat that would free up two sailors to join in the racing. Assisting in the running of a sailing race would count as participating in a working bee. If you are able to assist please let me know.

Our application to the minister for an exemption from becoming a caravan park is still in progress. We will advise the membership of any progress as it happens. In the meantime we are looking at more accurate cost estimates and what would be required if we have to comply. We are expecting to be able to present this to the June General Meeting.

The club grounds are looking good as usual and again thanks to all those who have assisted. Even though Neil has had limited mobility he has worked tirelessly on making the club grounds neat and well groomed for all of us to use. It is the responsibility of all members to clean up after themselves and if necessary others.

We have a large amount of visitors coming to the club and I would like to remind all members that visitors are limited to 4 visits per year, after that there is an expectation that they either join as members in their own right or not come to the club.

TOP CLUB RULES

CLUB GATE IS TO REMAIN LOCKED AT ALL TIMES (except for regattas and emergencies).

SPEED LIMIT is 10 kmh for all vehicles at all times by all members and guests.

YACHTS shall not be trailered through camping areas with masts erected due to the DANGER of overhead powerlines. **CHILDREN** are not allowed in the upstairs club rooms without adult supervision and in particular the toilet block as very young children can be seriously injured in wet areas.

CAMPFIRES only in approved containers between Labour Day weekend and Melbourne Cup day.

VISITORS to the Club are responsibility of the Member who invited them including their behaviour. All guests must sign the Visitors Book when day visiting, staying overnight or longer.

CAMPING FEES must be paid by all non caravan owning members and any overnight visitors BEFORE DEPARTURE.

NOISE CURFEW of 12.00 (midnight) please remember that noise travels at night. If you want to have a late night, then consider using the Clubhouse. Consider the other members in the Club. Anyone who persistently acts in a manner likely to upset other users of the Club, will be subject to Section 9 of the Statement of Purposes.

CLEAN UP AFTER YOURSELF - every member is welcome to use our Club facilities but please remember if you use it clean up after yourself.

MEMBERS WHO ARE DEEMED NON-FINANCIAL will have their gate access disabled.

ALL BUILDINGS, PAVING OR PERMANENT STRUCTURES need to be approved, prior to construction commencing. **BOAT STORAGE** is not transferable and DOES NOT need to be applied for each year.

NO STORAGE of boats or jet skis at caravans while members not in attendance.

NO SWIMMING in channel; however you can swim anywhere but keep off the boat ramps when boats are approaching and preparing to enter or leave the water.

LENDING OF KEYS is not permitted ever.

GAMES ROOM is for the use of all members. Hours are from 9.00am until 10.30pm.

NO PARKING on lawns around clubhouse or children's playground.

NO EMPTYING of porta loos into toilets.

ANIMALS - no animals ever.


QUAD BIKES can only be ridden by licensed drivers *
