BOATING

JOHN HARDY

We are planning to provide some sailing activities over the Xmas period.

Firstly, we will be conducting sail training for novices thru to experienced sailors, using club boats (provided by sailing members).

The plan is to start in the morning of 27th Dec with some on shore training/explanation of the various techniques required to sail a boat and keep it on course and upright. Understand what is needed to rig the boat, adjust course to suit wind etc and generally what makes it "sail". This will take about 2 hrs and will involve boats in the water as well as static, on shore demo's etc.

We will then allocate sailors to boats with experienced sailors and get ion the water and put it all into practice

The next day (28th Dec.), we can continue this activity with people who want to sail plus we will provide a similar activity focussing on the using power boats. The emphasis will be using powered boats to recover people from the water, effect safe towing of disabled vessels and generally learn how to properly control a powered boat safely.

The 29th will put it all together for a day on the water, using power and sail plus using experienced sailors to advise and coach people. This will assist in developing your confidence and skills on the water. A race course will be setup and we can see what you have learnt etc.

Please bring a PFD (life jacket) rated at level 50 or above, if you can as we have limited access to jackets.

It would be appreciated if you can contact us to book in so we can ensure we have everybody covered for the activities

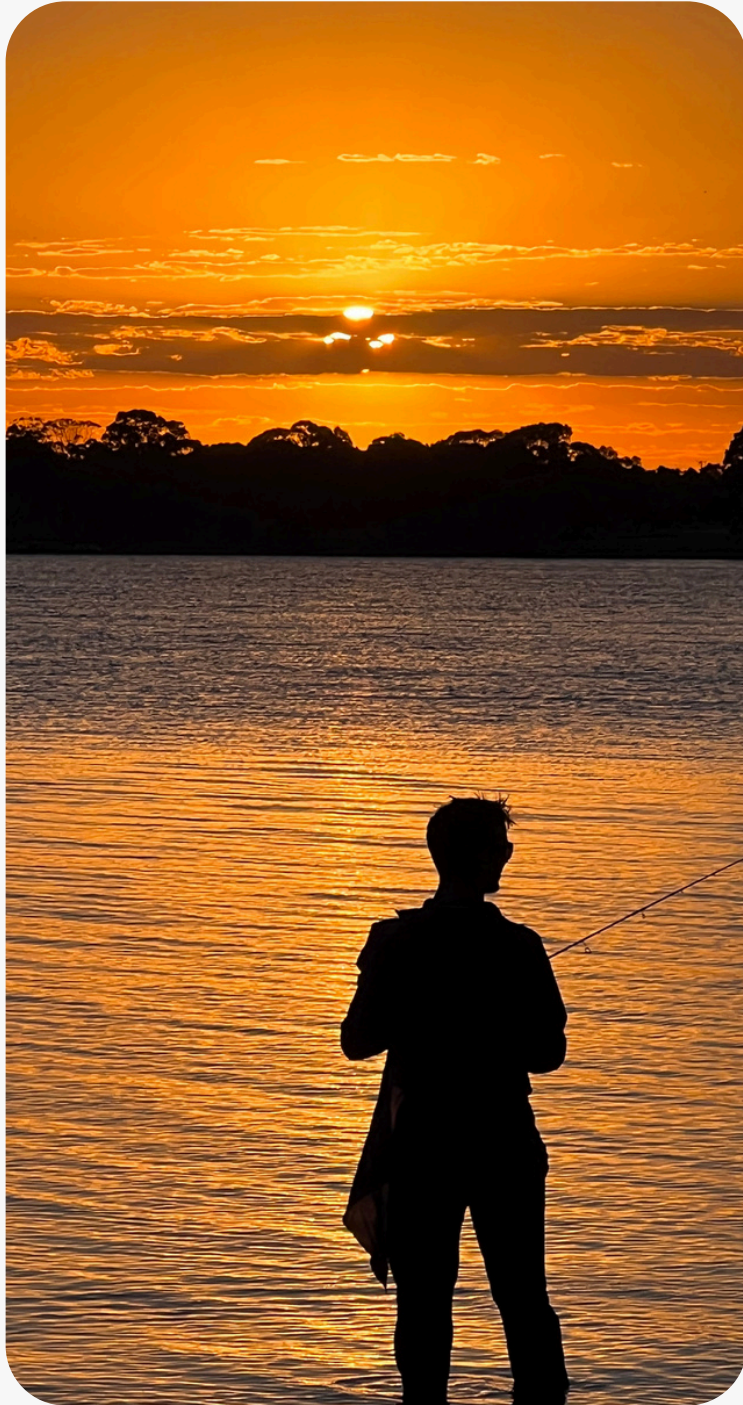

- Security cameras are currently being installed around the club grounds to enhance safety and security. This upgrade also includes improvements to the PA system to ensure all members can hear announcements clearly.
- A new split system air conditioning unit has been installed in the Clubhouse.
- The downstairs kiosk is now equipped with a fully operational bar fridge.
- Pest control spraying is scheduled for December 24th throughout the Club facilities. The spray being used is safe for people and will dry in just 20 minutes. Members will receive an email reminder about this.
- Both playgrounds are now removed to make way for a new playground installation at the Clubhouse.
- The lift project is still in progress, with some great progress being made - watch this space!
